Positive Sideline Behavior For Coaches, Parents, and Spectators

Parents and Spectators

- 1. Tell your child before each game that you are proud of him or her regardless of how well he or she plays.
- 2. Your biggest job is to cheer in a positive manner and applaud great plays and great efforts by ALL players on your team as well as the other team. MAKE IT FUN!
- 3. Don't give instructions to your child during the game. Let the coach "coach" the players.
- 4. Only registered team officials may talk to the referees.
- 5. If an official makes a "bad" call against your team? Honor the Game, BE SILENT!
- 6. Don't do anything in the heat of the moment that you will regret after the game. Ask yourself, "Will this embarrass my child or the team?"
- 7. Thank the coaches for their commitment and effort.
- 8. Remember to have fun! Enjoy the game.

Coaches

- 1. Inspire a love for the game and the desire to compete fairly.
- 2. Realize that you are a teacher (and role model) and that the soccer field is a classroom.
- 3. Develop respect for the ability of opponents as well as for the judgment of officials and opposing coaches.
- 4. As a role model and teacher refrain from exhibiting negative behavior such as shouting or arguing with the referees or the opposing team's coaches.
- YOU, THE COACH, are responsible for parents and spectators. Prior to the season, remind parents and players about the importance of positive behavior and the sideline behavior rules.
- 6. Be sure to give gentle reminders throughout the season and praise when players or spectators set a great example.

Everyone

- 1. Alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs before, during, or after games are expressly prohibited.
- 2. The use of tobacco is not allowed on any soccer field or within 25 yards of any ABSC-affiliated activity involving youth players.
- **3.** Each team is responsible for making sure that all trash has been removed from the game area before they disperse.
