ALBANY BERKELEY SOCCER CLUB ATHLETES LACE UP 4 PEDIATRIC CANCER® TO SUPPORT KIDS WITH CANCER AT UCSF BENIOFF CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL OAKLAND

DATE- Oakland, CA/Cherry Hill, NJ: The Albany Berkeley Soccer Club (ABSC) is teaming up with Go4theGoal Foundation and UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital Oakland this September in honor of Pediatric Cancer Awareness Month. During the ABSC World Cup on Monday, September 7th, ABSC's 350 soccer players will lace up their cleats with Go4theGoal's gold laces to raise awareness and support for local kids with cancer.

In September 2014, Akron Children's Hospital introduced Go4theGoal's Lace Up 4 Pediatric Cancer® campaign to local teams and athletes. In 4 weeks, the two organizations raised \$25,000 to provide financial assistance to the families of pediatric cancer patients. Due to the success of the partnership in 2014, Go4theGoal has partnered with 20 hospitals across the country to create similar awareness and support in other communities.

UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital Oakland's September awareness initiative is being spearheaded by Dr. Caroline Hastings, M.D, Director of the Fellowship Program of the Department of Pediatric Hematology Oncology. "I have been working here for 29 years and it's amazing to me how many people don't know how many kids we treat

for many types of cancer," said Dr. Hastings. "Many of these kids are classmates, team mates, and siblings of many of our fortunate healthy young athletes. I started this as a result of my youngest daughter's disconcerting plea to me that kids really want to help but it is difficult to know what to do because they are not the ones with money or ability."

"We started Lace Up 4 Pediatric Cancer® when youth soccer teams in New Jersey reached out wanting to know how they could help make a difference," said Beth Stefanacci, Go4theGoal's Executive Director. "It is amazing how much of an impact children and teens can have in their communities when they are given a chance. We are honored to have the players of ABSC Lace Up and raise awareness among their community and show local kids with cancer and their families that they are not in the fight alone!"

Proceeds from the sale of the laces and 100% of any donations will go towards funding psychological intervention at <u>UCSF Benioff</u> Children's Hospital Oakland for patients and families going through this toughest time of their lives. If the partnership exceeds the goal of \$50,000, the additional funding will support the Survivorship Program to assist in providing long term care for survivors that may develop long term complications from their treatment.
